Transfer of genetic resources

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection of the Republic of Belarus (hereinafter referred to as “the Ministry of Natural Resources”) has considered the letter of the Institute of Genetics and Cytology of the National Academy of Sciences of Belarus of August 3, 2018 No. 271-08/734 and has no objections to the transfer of 103 filters with the fixed DNA of invertebrates and fish to the University of Otago (New Zealand) for scientific research.

We draw attention to the fact that in order to comply with the requirements of the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization to the Convention on Biological Diversity the Republic of Belarus acceded to by the Decree of the President of the Republic of Belarus of May 22, 2014 No. 235 and obtain a permit for the transfer of genetic resources, you will need to provide detailed information on the genetic resource and its use (commercial and/or non-commercial), as well as confirmation that mutually agreed terms between the provider and user of the genetic resources have been concluded.
