The Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection of the Republic of Belarus has considered the letter of the State Scientific Institution “Institute of Genetics and Cytology of the National Academy of Sciences of Belarus” dated August 23, 2018 No. 271-08/802 and confirms that the transfer of 103 filters with the fixed DNA of invertebrates and fish to the University of Otago (New Zealand) for scientific research (non-commercial use) is carried out on the basis of mutually agreed terms for sharing of genetic resources transferred and the distribution of anticipated (non-monetary) benefits concluded between the State Scientific and Production Amalgamation “Scientific and Practical Center for Bioresources of the National Academy of Sciences of Belarus” and the University of Otago and in accordance with the requirements of the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization to the Convention on Biological Diversity.
