PERMIT CONDITIONS:-NEMA/AGR/59/2015

1. This approval shall be valid for **12 months** from the date of issuance and shall not be transferable.

This approval is for accessing Not more than :**One drop of blood (0.05ml) and one pin feather with a sheath sampled and coded from 600 vulturine guineafowls that live in Mpala Research Center (0° 17'N, 37° 52' E).** For Export. You shall provide the list and quantity of all collected blood, feathers from vulturine guineafowl (*Acryllium vulturinum*) species to NEMA.

2. The access of the genetic resources and its derivatives shall be strictly for the project titled "*Collective Movement, social dynamics and fitness consequences of social decision-making across temporal scales*". For **Vulturine Guineafowl (*Acryllium vulturinum*)** in Northern Kenya. In Impala Research Center Nanyuki. You shall ensure that the samples taken are well treated and preserved using the provided standards before export.
3. You shall ensure that the basic analysis of the genetic resource such as long-term tracking, tagging, coding, wing ringing, short-term high resolution tagging, field experiments catching and processing birds and preparation of samples to good laboratory standards for export and further analysis shall be done in the local institutions, preferably at IMPALA, KWS or NMK accordingly. Ensure that the local partner is involved in the collection, identification and preparation of the samples for export.
4. The genetic resource and the derivative shall **not be transferred to a third party** without the consent of the genetic resource providers and NEMA.
5. The genetic resource and the derivative shall **not** be used for commercial or profit purpose without understanding from genetic resource providers and NEMA.
6. You shall **deposit and keep records of all duplicates** of the genetic resources with the relevant lead agency (NMK and KWS) and provide evidence of deposition to NEMA.
7. You shall ensure that there is reasonable access by all Kenyan citizens to all genetic resources collected whether such **genetic resources and intangible components** are held locally or abroad.
8. Ensure that all agreements entered into with respect to access of genetic resources shall be strictly for the purposes for which they were entered into.
9. You shall abide by the provision of the Material Transfer Agreements entered with the providers of genetic resources. You shall ensure that the local community Traditional knowledge **including digital sequences** on the genetic resources and their uses are well safeguarded.
10. You shall furnish quarterly reports to NEMA on the status of research, including all discoveries from research involving genetic resources and/or intangible components thereof.
11. You shall abide by the laws of Kenya. You shall comply with the improvement orders issued by NEMA's environmental inspectors throughout the project cycle. NEMA reserves the right to suspend, cancel, revoke or vary this permit in the event of a breach of the conditions stated herein or any contravention to the Environmental Management and Coordination Act, CAP 387 and regulations thereunder.
12. Upon the completion of the intended studies, you shall return the remaining genetic resource to Kenya and deposit with the relevant lead agency (NMK/KWS) and notify NEMA of the return.
